Personal Protective Equipment - PPE

- Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) requires the use of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) to protect your staff members to reduce employee exposure to hazards in the workplace.
- OSHA's General PPE Standard is 29 CFR 1910.132 requires that employers systematically assess the workplace to identify hazards and subsequently to select PPE to effectively protect workers from those identified hazards.
- PPE is a point of contact control, pre-contact and point-of-contact control.
- Training on PPE is imperative and OSHA requires employers provide training to each employee who has been required by way of the hazard assessment to use PPE.
- If companies violate OSHA regulations, they're get fined. The amount of fines varies on the severity of the violation.
